### ELG Timeline

>

State permits renewed after February 1st 2010, must adopt the ELG into the state permits. However, Permittees have 18 months before they are required to meet the 280 NTU numeric limit for sites greater than 20 acres disturbed.

>

Beginning, August 2011, permittees have to be in compliance with the numeric limit for all sites disturbing over 20 acres, unless the state permit has not expired yet.

Beginning, February 1st, 2014 all sites over 10 acres disturbed have to be in compliance with the 280 NTU numeric limit, unless the state permit has not expired yet.

Check with your state permitting authority for up to date information
